What Membership isn't:

- It is not about being in or out
- It does not give you a louder voice (to have your say)
- It does not mean you get more pastoral care
- It does not mean you have to give to the church anymore than normal
- It does not mean you can now take communion (you don't have to be a member to receive communion)
- It is more than just attending meetings

What Membership is:

- It is about being committed to the community
- It is about serving within the community

- 1. Speak to Michael re becoming a member
- 2. Meet with two members of the church over a coffee
- 3. Vote at the next Members Meeting
- 4. Receive hand of friendship at next Communion

- 1. Tell your church of your intention to transfer
- Ask the church sectary to write to us our church sectary with permission to transfer
- Confirmation at next members meeting
- 4. Receive hand of friendship at next Communion

- So we are part of a local Baptist association (SWBA) and the national BUGB
